### Histograms - how to use them.

A Histogram is a graph of the amount of light at different frequencies within a photo. It is not necessary to have every part of the photo at the same level, but it is important to have the histogram within certain limits.

The peak of each level is also not vital. Histograms can be used with both color and black-and-white photos, the principles are the same.

!. Expose your photo so the bulk of the histogram is to the right.

2 Ensure that the furthest right (white level) and the furthest left (black level) are both within the frame of the histogram. It is not essential that the histogram touches either the left or right extreme.


Here is an example of a 'perfect histogram" -right skewed, within the limits, and with color peaks at the top of the histogram frame. The separate peaks show that there is good contrast within the picture. The picture was taken at f11 aperture and 1/80 shutterspeed

### Histograms - how to use them.


Here is an example of an overexposed photo. Note the histogram is crushed completely to the right, with a vertical cutoff right against the frame, and no light at all in the left, i.e, no dark parts.



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### Histograms - how to use them.


Here is an example of an underexposed photo. Note the histogram is skewed to the left, with a vertical cutoff left against the frame, and a very small amount to the right, i.e, no light parts.




